



The New Jersey Teacher Leader Policy Fellowship is an opportunity for New Jersey teacher leaders (Fellows) to learn about and engage in education policy and advocacy in New Jersey.

The Program

New Jersey Teacher Leader Policy Fellowship participants (Fellows) engage in a year-long fellowship to study the NJ education policy landscape, hone their advocacy skills, and achieve a short-term advocacy goal.

In addition to engaging in high-quality professional learning and networking opportunities, **Fellows receive a \$2,500 stipend** for their commitment to this work.

What to Expect

Convenings are rich with current research, expert discussions, and exploratory activities designed to expand participants' knowledge and understanding of the current NJ education policy landscape, as well as support them in taking action in advocating at the state or local level.

Throughout the course of the Fellowship, Fellows:

- Research a current key priority area* and identify a problem of practice to address within their selected area;
- Learn the advocacy process and establish a goal and key strategies in their identified focus area;
- Achieve a short-term advocacy milestone; and
- Increase their professional network and opportunities to be advocates.

Convenings

We are passionate about this work because we believe that:

1. Practicing classroom teachers are a critical stakeholder in advising and influencing the mission and vision of education organizations.
2. Practicing teachers must be informed and knowledgeable about education systems and policies in order to actively and effectively engage in advocacy to benefit student outcomes.
3. Teacher leadership, or the ability for teachers to influence colleagues and the profession while maintaining classroom responsibilities, will keep great teachers in classrooms where they can have the biggest impact on student outcomes. Teacher leadership also allows practicing teachers to meaningfully contribute to the development and implementation of education policy.

- Have a minimum of two years of experience teaching in New Jersey's schools; and
- Commit to attending all meetings and convenings and completing any associated readings or activities for the convenings
